#### 1. Benjamin Davis.

The family as follows came from Virginia and in 1795 was in Mercer County, KY on the tax rolls of the William Gaines District: Benjamin, James, Joseph, as well as Charles, Samuel, James (overseer), Joshua and William Davis and Ambrose Gordon.

They came to Hopkins County by the time it was founded in 1807.

The suit filed in Hopkins County, Kentucky, found in bundle #65 - 1809-1812, filed February 24, 1809, provides much data on the makeup of this family. Also see B223<sup>1</sup> and B540<sup>2</sup>.

His name derives from Peggy Brown Chapman in The Bourland Bulletin, No. 4, 1997.

Benjamin married Priscilla Davis.

**2. James Davis** (Benjamin<sup>1</sup>). Born in 1740/1750. James died in May 1808 in Hopkins Cty, KY. Occupation: Carpenter, Joiner.

On March 22, 1782, James sold his Montgomery County land to Richard, receiving 200 acres of Richard's Mercer County land, certain live stock and some money, which was subsequently paid at Gordon's Station in Mercer County, the home of Joseph Davis, who had married Captain John Gordon's wife, Elizabeth Grayson Gordon, in 1783.

James moved to the Dix River tract in Mercer County in the fall of 1781, and settled there with his family. The place was one and a half miles from his brother

Joseph's residence. James resided there 15 years, and in the years 1790-1-2, he built a stone house 20' x 30' in the clear, one story with an underground passage and kitchen. He was a house carpenter and joiner by trade, and he and his sons, Harrison and James, Jr. sawed the scuttlings, made the shingles, and constructed the woodwork. They also worked at the building trade in Harrodsburg in 1792.

In 1795, he left Mercer County, moving to Montgomery, where he stayed two years, coming thence to Henderson County (now Hopkins) in 1798. His brother Joseph and his children and step-children had preceded him by one year.

James Davis was at one time worth 12-13 hundred pounds, when he came to the Green River country was still worth \$2,500. Richard Davis also removed from Lincoln Co., Virginia, to Mercer Co., Kentucky, and thence to Henderson (Hopkins) Co.

He is probably the James Davis who owned 350 acres on the Pond River and 100 acres on Flat Creek in 1807 Hopkins County, according to the March 2005 Yesterday's Tuckaways.

James married Ann Lnu.

**3. Joseph Davis** (Benjamin<sup>1</sup>). Born in 1740/1750. Joseph died on 19 Oct 1821 in Hopkins Cty, KY.

On 3 Sep 1783 Joseph married Elizabeth "Betty" Grayson, daughter of John Grayson (~1728-1800) & Barbara Burdyne, in Mercer Cty, KY. Born abt 1750 in Culpeper Cty, VA. Elizabeth "Betty" died in 1797 in Lincoln Cty, KY.

Her father conveyed to them 254 acres on Gourdvine Fork of the Rappahannock, in Culpeper County, VA.

4. John Davis (Benjamin<sup>1</sup>). Born in 1752. John died on 13 Aug 1829 in Hopkins

Cty, KY.

He served in the Virginia Line and applied on October 13, 1828 for a pension, number S35876, at age 76, having enlisted at Bedford City, Virginia. His pension paid only \$79.22 as he died soon thereafter.

He did not marry.

**5. Thomas Davis** (Benjamin<sup>1</sup>). Born abt 1756. Thomas died in Dec 1842 in Hopkins Cty, KY.

!Thomas probably never married. His will is B306. In that will he freed slaves named Bristoe, Abba and Sarah and gave them land, stock and faming tools. The will names many Hopkins County names. including Robertson, Woodruff, Davis, Morton, Hardwicke, Malin, and others.

**6. Richard Davis** (Benjamin<sup>1</sup>). Born in 1746 in VA. Richard died on 7 Oct 1812 in Hopkins Cty, KY. Occupation: Sheriff.

He served three years in the Revolutionary War. Upon enlistment as a private he was granted 200 acres; upon his promotion to sergeant the land grant was increased to 2,000 acres. He moved to Hopkins County in 1784.

When Hopkins County was formed, the History says, "From the south end came Dick Davis with his long beard and pigtail, in ancient swallow tail coat".

He was the best known of the brothers, and was called "Squire Davis". He was one of the several who helped form Hopkins County in 1806-7; was one of the first magistrates or Justices of the Peace; and the first Sheriff.<sup>3</sup>

When he came to Kentucky he bought about 2,000 acres of military lands about 9 miles south of Madisonville. He later built the first brick house in Hopkins County. See  $B311.^3$ 

He and Ann deeded 250 acres in Montgomery County, Kentucky in 1810 to son Thomas C. Davis. See B305 for his will, dated 7 Oct 1812, proven November in the County Court of 1812. Witnesses: Saml. H. Earle, Moses Steele, John Davis.

In 1773 Richard married Ann "Nancy" Chiles, daughter of Henry Chiles & Mary Carr, in Spotsylvania Cty, VA. Born in 1755 in VA. Ann "Nancy" died on 28 Jul 1849 in Hopkins Cty, KY.

On 19 Jan 1795 Charles married Catherine Tethero, in Mercer Cty, KY.

#### 8. Elizabeth Davis (Benjamin<sup>1</sup>).

She is thought to be sister to these brothers. See Bourland Bulletin, No. 4, 1997.

On 29 Apr 1765 Elizabeth married Isham Talbot, son of Matthew Talbot (-1758) & Jane Clayton (~1714-), in Bedford Cty, VA. Born on 3 Nov 1738 in Lunenburg Cty, VA. Isham died in probably Henderson Cty, KY, on 25 Sep 1825; he was 86.

Isham Talbot served as a 1st Lieutenant in the 5th Regiment, Virginia Line. While we know few details about his service record, it was of sufficient distinction for the DAR to recognize his service and admit his descendants on the basis of that record.

Sometime before October 1785, Isham relocated his family to Kentucky, settling first in the area around Harrodsburg. It is possible, even likely, that Isham's departure for Kentucky coincided with the departure of his older half brother, John, for Georgia.

Isham moved his family to the area around the present day community of Harrodsburg. The distance from Bedford to Harrodsburg was about 400 miles using 21st century roads. He established himself quickly and within a few years, his holdings exceeded that of any other person in the county, including more than 18000 acres located in various places around the state.

There were 3 Isham Talbots in KY at about the same time. They were all related but the connections are fuzzy. This Isham is reported by some to be the older half brother of the Senator Talbot, who had come to Mercer Co. from Bedford Co. VA. He may have raised the younger Isham & Elizabeth as adopted children. I have been researching this line and know some about the Henderson Co. connections with Edmund Talbot (son of other Isham), first surveyor of that county.

They were all decendants of Mathew Talbot of New London, VA where the Bedford Co. Court house began in his cabin. My third great grandfather was named for him (Mathew Talbot Duncan - James Ray's grandson) - Mathew Talbot would be a fifth great grandfather. I finally found the Senator Talbot's grave in Frankfort. It was not in the original location since the Frankfort Cemetery wasn't started until ten years after his death.

**9. Harrison Davis** (James<sup>2</sup>, Benjamin<sup>1</sup>). Born abt 1769.

See page 19 of <u>Davis-Woodruff Families of Western Kentucky</u> <sup>1</sup>by Virginia Couchot for the reasoning behind the assignment of these children to Harrison, instead of John or \_\_\_\_\_ Davis. However, Peggy Brown Chapman believes Harrison's children belong to Charles, based on the will of Thomas Davis which is difficult to read but clearly names Joseph Davis' children Thomas G and Benjamin Davis.

Harrison is gone from the Hopkins County tax rolls of 1830 and may have gone to Missouri.

The following may relate to him: Harrison Davis, born about 1773; married Patsey Crockett on Aug. 30, 1798 in Montgomery County, Kentucky. Ceremony performed by Joseph P. Howe. His will was probated in Christian County, KY in 1817.

He is probably the Harrison Davis who owned 500 acres on the Pond River in 1807 Hopkins County, according to the March 2005 Yesterday's Tuckaways.

Harrison married Martha "Patsy" Smith.

She may first have married a Crockett.

**10. James Davis Jr** (James<sup>2</sup>, Benjamin<sup>1</sup>). Born abt 1772. James died in 1802 in Henderson Cty, KY.

There is a serious heritage problem on the James Davis', as to which married Martha Ligon and which married Nancy Moore Morton and who were the father's.

Nonetheless, accepting it as posted to the database, and provided by Peggy Brown Chapman: A:364-365. Articles of agreement made & concluded on the 10th day of Dec 1802 between Thomas Morton & James Davis executors of the estate of James Davis, Jr., dec'd of the one part and Caleb Hall of the other part sheweth that the sd Exs hath agreed.. put into peaceable possession & safe keeping of sd Hall two feather beds & furniture all the land and slaves belonging to the orphans.. until the eldest becomes 14 years of age which will be in Mar 1813. [James]. Hall agrees to keep the plantation in good repair & pay land tax use, keep the slaves together and pay their tax, support his wife Martha and tenderly to raise the orphans, and as soon as they are capable of learning to give them regular schooling until that time to which agreement the parties doth hereby bind themselves.. etc. 500 pds. S/ Thomas Morton,James Davis,Caleb Hall, Jr. Wit: William R. McGary, Benjamin Davis, Robert Davis. Ack. by Thomas Morton, James Davis & Caleb Hall & by oaths of William R. McGary & Benjamin Davis. r 5 Mar 1803.

On 21 Jun 1795 James married Martha "Patsy" Ligon, daughter of Thomas Ligon & Ann Lnu, in Mercer Cty, KY. Born on 11 Jul 1780 in VA. Martha "Patsy" died in Hopkins Cty, KY, on 6 Sep 1854; she was 74. Martha "Patsy" was buried in Grapevine Cemetery, Madisonville, Hopkins Cty, KY.

She was a charter member of the Grapevine Christian Church, in 1834.

He probably went to Missouri.

**12. Robert Davis** (James<sup>2</sup>, Benjamin<sup>1</sup>). Born on 14 Sep 1777 in PA. Robert died in Aug 1844 in Callaway Cty, MO.

The bond for his marriage was consented to by father William Hornbuckle and witnessed by Hugh McGary and Jun. & Thomas Hornbuckle.

On 27 Nov 1804 when Robert was 27, he married Deborah Hornbuckle, daughter of William Hornbuckle & Sarah Hardin, in Jessamine Cty, KY. Born on 2 Mar 1787 in Rockingham, NC. Deborah died abt 1848 in Fulton, MO.

**13. Delicia Davis** (James<sup>2</sup>, Benjamin<sup>1</sup>). Born abt 1778. Delicia died abt 1808.

On 15 Mar 1794 Delicia married Robert McGary Sr, Half GGGG Uncle, son of Hugh McGary Sr (1744-~1806) & Mary Buntin (1735-1779), in Mercer Cty, KY. with John Rice officiating. Born on 27 Sep 1767 in VA or NC. Robert died in 1840 in Gibson Cty, IN.

He moved with brothers Daniel and William Ray into Henderson County in 1798. It was in his house that the organizing committee for Hopkins County met. When his wife Delicia died around 1808, he moved to Gibson County, Indiana and married again.

After Delicia's death, William R. McGary was named guardian of the children.

In 1806 he conveyed 52 acres on both sides of Flat Creek to William Berry in Henderson Deed Bk A, pp. 421-422. Later he conveyed in 1810 200 more acres.

Robert McGary 26: 1807; Tax List for Hopkins County with 7 slaves and 5 horses.

Robert McGary 27: May 25, 1807; Hopkins County, KY formed in his house.

Robert McGary 28: July 27, 1807; Appointed commissioner of Hopkins County along with Daniel Ashby and John Davis.

Robert McGary 29: July 27, 1807; Daniel Ashby, John Davis, Robert McGary: Appointed commissioners of the court for erecting the new jail and courthouse in Hopkins County.

Robert McGary 30 November 1807 living in Indiana as he posted bond for widow Hamilton.

Robert McGary 32: Bet. July 27 - November 30, 1807; Moved to Gibson County,  $IN.^4$ 

Robert McGary 33: April 3, 1809; Voted as resident of Wabash Township of Knox County, IN.

14. Elizabeth "Betsy" Davis (James<sup>2</sup>, Benjamin<sup>1</sup>).

In Jul 1797 Elizabeth "Betsy" married William Ray McGary, GGGG Uncle, son of Hugh McGary Sr (1744-~1806) & Catherine "Caty" Yocum (1758-~1803). Born on 4 Apr 1782 in NC.

He was in Barren County with his father from 1800 until 1801, at which point he moved with brothers Robert and Daniel into Henderson County.

Upon the formation of the county of Hopkins, he was appointed to the Grand Jury.<sup>5</sup>

He opened a tavern at his house in the "Hog Eye" block near the corner of present day East Broadway and South Union Street on original lot #27. He established the tavern in competition with William Noel's tavern. The date would have been about 1808 and in April of that year the County Court set tavern rates within the county as seen in the 2004 Hopkins County Historical Society Yearbook. A night's rest was 12¢, rum sold for \$2.66 and wine for \$4.00 per gallon. It would be interesting to know if his father's wine was more expensive since it was the first vineyard in the state. (see Notes on Hugh McGary.)

He and Elizabeth Davis McGary moved to Gibson County, Indiana and later to Vanderburgh County, Indiana.

Hopkins Co. Deed Book 3:119 3 January 1820 William R. McGary and his wife Elizabeth of Vanderburgh Co. Indiana sold for \$250 to Thomas Cardwell of Hopkins Co. two lots in Madisonville. Wit: Joseph Robertson, Winston Harvey and J.W.G. Godman.

B649 details certain land transactions between Hugh McGary and his children and they in turn to others.

Capt. William R. McGary's Company, 5th Regiment, Kentucky Militia , commanded by Colonel Henry Remick. This company was formed from Hopkins County in answer to the governor's call. Gabriel and Samuel Bourland both joined.

On 30 May 1806 Sarah "Sally" married John Parker, in Christian Cty, KY.

On 3 Aug 1809 Mary "Polly" married Pearson Newson, in Hopkins Cty, KY. with Rev. John Bourland officiating.

On 8 Oct 1807 Martha "Patsy" married John Robertson, GGGG Uncle, son of William Robertson (~1760->1842) & Sinah Claywell Ashby (~1757->1842), in Hopkins Cty, KY. with Rev. John Bourland officiating. Born abt 1775.

He owned a "Tavern House", as cited in depositions in a William Berry Suit against several family members. See Yesterday's Tuckaways, Volume 32, No. 4, Winter 2000.

**20. Benjamin Davis** (Joseph<sup>2</sup>, Benjamin<sup>1</sup>). Born in 1783. Benjamin died abt 1847 in Hopkins Cty, KY.

It is possible Benjamin's mother was a first wife of Joseph.

On 6 Aug 1817 Benjamin married Nancy Coghill, in Mercer Cty, KY. Born abt 1786 in KY.

She is in the Israel Davis household, her son, in the 1850 Census of Hopkins County.

On 28 Jul 1816 Thomas Grayson married Lucy M Brooks, in Muhlenberg Cty, KY.

**22. Priscilla Rebecca Davis** (Joseph<sup>2</sup>, Benjamin<sup>1</sup>). Born on 11 Jun 1787 in Mercer Cty, KY. Priscilla Rebecca died in Calloway Cty, KY, on 6 Feb 1880; she was 92.

Abt 1804 Priscilla Rebecca married James William Martin, 1C4R, son of Benjamin Martin Jr (~1740-1821) & Sarah Baker (~1744-1811). Born on 12 May 1782 in Orange Cty, VA. James William died in Calloway Cty, KY, on 27 Jun 1857; he was 75. Occupation: Blacksmith.

They lived in Hopkins County and were among the earliest settlers of Callaway County, Kentucky.

In 1821 he bought property in Calloway County, KY and there erected a brick home in which he lived until his death.

**23. Elizabeth Davis** (Richard<sup>2</sup>, Benjamin<sup>1</sup>). Born on 14 Sep 1776 in VA. Elizabeth died in Hopkins Cty, KY, on 7 Oct 1869; she was 93.

On 25 Aug 1791 when Elizabeth was 14, she married Thomas Morton Sr, son of Samuel Morton (1711-1764) & Ann Moore (1725-), in Clark Cty, KY. Born on 24 Sep 1764 in Richmond, VA. Thomas died in Morton's Gap, Hopkins Cty, KY, on 3 May 1844; he was 79. Thomas was buried in Morton home plot, Morton's Gap, Hopkins Cty, KY.

The town of Morton's Gap was named after Thomas and this family. He was born in Richmond, Virginia and moved to Clark County, Kentucky at age 26, in 1791, where he met and married Elizabeth Davis. Several years later in 1789 he moved to what became Morton's Gap.

He was a most industrious man and he cleared the land and raised the family. He built in 1804 a two-story brick rectangular brick house with two rooms on each floor and a gabled roof. This home stood for 132 years and was the first brick house in the County. Bricks for the house were burned on the spot, resulting in bricks of varying colors from yellow to deep red - the color difference due to the amount of heat used. Since the 1807 Tax Roll shows him with 9 slaves, it is reasonable to think he had much help on the home building. They moved into the new home in 1804 and on that same day their old house burned down. The new house lasted 132 years and was located where the current Morton's Gap school is.

About 3/4 miles from this home were the Peaks of Otter, or the highest point in Hopkins County, and the valley betwen them was later called the Gap, thus providing the name of the eventual town.

When he died, 966 acres were divided between 10 of 12 children. Excluded were Priscilla and Elizabeth H.

**24.** Dr Thomas Chiles "Red Tom" Davis (Richard<sup>2</sup>, Benjamin<sup>1</sup>). Born abt 1779 in VA. Thomas Chiles "Red Tom" died in 1813 in Battle of River Raisin, War of 1812, MI.

He was a regimental surgeon who died in the War of 1812 at the Battle of River Raisin. His name is among those inscribed on the Kentucky State Military Monument in Frankfort "in commemoration of their valorous service in defense of their country".

He was called "Red Tom". See B311.

On 16 Feb 1808 Thomas Chiles "Red Tom" married Elizabeth Dabney Chiles, daughter of Walter Chiles & Phoebe Carr, in Shelby Cty, KY.

Is her name actually Elizabeth Chiles, who married a Dabney before marrying Davis, her first cousin?

When Hopkins County was formed, the History says, "William Davis, son of Dick Davis, demonstrated his marksmanship under the rise down the path to the left".

William Davis was a veteran in the War of 1812, serving under General William Henry Harrison; after the war he returned to Hopkins County where he married, and where his father gave him a farm upon which he resided until his death in 1849 or 1850, in about his 62nd year.

Some believe Orlando Earl Davis was their son.

I wish all my just debts to be paid and the partner-ship I am now in with my ever beloved Brother I wish to be closd. as soon as would be convenient. 2nd. I wish my ever beloved wife Nancy Given after all the Just debts are paid to have the one third part of my estate during her natural life both personal and real and at her decease to go equally to my children except the sum of five hundred dollars which I allow my wife to dispose of as she may please 3rd. I wish the remaining two thirds of my estate to be equally divided Between Fayette Henry Given, Mary Lucinda Given and Augustus Ney? Given and if Doctor James A. White, who now has my other child Easther Araminta Given in his possession should not immediately on my decease settle on her as much or more than I have to give my other children agreeable to his promise--In case of his failure a thing I think there is no doubt to be entertained but what he will comply as I always had and doe view him as a man of the strictest honour and integrity I say in case of his failure as above I wish my daughter as above mentioned Easther Araminta Given to have an equal part with the balance of my children and I wish if he should comply as promised I wish to give my daughter in remembrance that she may not think after I am dead and cold in the grave that because she did not live with me I had forgot her--I say I wish her to have a present out of any part of my property to the amt. of two Hundred dollars or to that amt. in anything she may fancy. I wish my executor which will be hereafter mentioned to get and purchase any thing she may want to that amt. above stated because she is absent? perhaps she may see those lines I wish to here observe to her that my affection is as strong as ever is (sic) was for any of my children for her 4th. I wish my ever beloved Brother Joseph R. Given my present partner and only brother to be my executor to take charge of all my earthly efects and I wish him not to be bound in any security I further wish him in case my beloved wife should ever marry again a thing I think likely as she is yet young to take charge of my children and put them out to school and not suffer them to live with a step father as step fathers are so apt to abuse children I wish here to observe for fear my ever dear wife may think this hard as she has suffered many pains and fatigues in raising those children that I have the utmost confidence in her and if I should never see her more I will here observe that I believe I have been blessed with one of the most affectionate and beloved companions that ever man was blessed with but if her 2nd Husband was to go to abuse my children what could a woman's arm do to hinder such abuse and my blood runs cold now in my Veighens to think of my little darling Babes receiving the stripes from a step father, - I should be glad if my wife could reconcile it to herself to never marry and raise our little darlings and her and my dear Brother conduct their education both male & female but this from the common corse of things I could hardly expect as she is young. She may now think she will never marry but I fear will get out of that notion. 5th. I wish

my children to have a complete education if it should take the chief part of their patrimony to doe it - I doe not wish them to labour under the same disadvantages that I doe my mind being as good as many others that is calld men of tallent, yet language is denyd. me to convey my Eides for the lack of education. both male & female I wish completely educated - this I will leave particularly with my brother for him to conduct their education with the advice &c. of my dear wife so long as she remains a widow -- I wish my dear wife to have and keep my portrait remembering at same time that is the resemblance of a man who was dearly attached to her and if the other world we should ever meet and be known to each other it would be gratifying to me in the extreme to see the partner of all my pleasures and griefs and know at same time she had well done her part below with our dear babes which lies heaviest on my mind, that and parting with my friends here below. And at her decease for my portrait to be given to some one of my children that appears the most anxious for to keep my resemblance. this will be judged off by my executor 6th. I wish here to observe that one principle reason for making my will at this time is that if I never should return I do not wish the County Court of Livingston to have any management of my children as I have always thought it was universely done by them. I do not wish to hurt their feelings of said Court many and indeed the most of them I venerate as men of a great deal of goodness of heart not surpassed by any but merely? the difference of opinion be- tween them and me. 7- I wish my negros and real estate to be divided and indeed all of my estate that can be done without selling I wish the whole management to be in my executor to sell or keep the pers- onal estate as he may think would be best And I wish my negro boy Nero to live with my wife during her widowhood to manage and take care for her and when she marry I wish him to be sett free or I will leave it with my executor to sett him free or treat him as well as if he was free he has been a faithful servant to me and I would note he should not be abused but will leave this entirely with my executor to do as he pleases - In testamony whereof I have hereunto set my hand date above - I certify to the world this is my hand writing for above purpose -Dickson Given Commonwealth of Kentucky Livingston County Towit

I Jesse Patterson Clerk of the County Court for the County aforesaid do hereby certify that this the last will and testament of Dickson Given decd. was this day produced in open court and proven by the oaths of Joseph Watts, Robert A. Talbot, Isham, a Senator from Kentucky; born near Talbot, Bedford County, Va., in 1773; moved with his father to Harrodsburg, Ky.; completed preparatory studies; studied law; was admitted to the bar and commenced practice in Versailles, Ky.; moved to Frankfort, Ky., and continued the practice of law; member, State senate 1812-1815; elected as a Republican to the United States Senate to fill the vacancy

caused by the resignation of Bledsoe and served from February 2, 1815, to March 3, 1819; again elected to the United States Senate to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of William Logan and served from October 19, 1820, to March 3, 1825; resumed the practice of law; died near Frankfort, Ky., September 25, 1837; interment in the State Cemetery, Frankfort, Ky.<sup>6</sup>

ISHAM TALBOT was born in the county of Bedford, the State of Virginia, in the year 1772. While guite a youth, his father emigrated with his family to Kentucky, and settled near Harrodsburg, in Mercer county. The means of acquiring an education, at that early day, were necessarily limited, and each individual in the pursuit of knowledge, had to rely, in a great degree, on the resources of his own intellect and will. Young Talbot was sent to the best schools of Harrodsburg; but he acquired, without the aid of teachers, a respectable knowledge of the ancient and some of the modern languages. On arriving at manhood, he studied law with Colonel George Nicholas, and commenced the practice of his profession in the town of Versailles, in Woodford county. He soon afterwards removed to Frankfort, and entered the lists when Clay, and Daviess, and Bibb, and Bledsoe, and Rowan adorned the bar; and public opinion of that day and this, has regarded Mr. Talbot as one of the brightest in that galaxy of illustrious names. In 1812, he was elected to the senate of Kentucky from the county of Franklin, which office he continued to hold until his election, in 1815, to the senate of the United States, to fill the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of Jesse Bledsoe. In 1820, he was reelected to the senate, and served in that body till the 4th of March, 1825. Mr. Talbot's career in the senate is a part of the history of our common country, and the reports of the debates of that body bear ample proofs of his eloquence and patriotism. He died at Melrose, his residence near Frankfort, on the 21st of September, 1837.

Isham first married Adelaid Lnu.

Isham second married Polly Thornton Taylor.

On 24 Jan 1804 Isham third married Margaret "Peggy" Garrard, daughter of James Garrard (1749-1822) & Elizabeth Mountjoy (1751-1832), in Franklin Cty, KY. Born on 31 Jul 1788 in Mt Lebanon, Bourbon Cty, KY. Margaret "Peggy" died in Bourbon Cty, KY, on 22 Mar 1815; she was 26.

On 20 Nov 1826 when John was 30, he first married Sarah E Metcalf, in Hopkins Cty, KY. Born on 9 Mar 1809 in KY. Sarah E died on 25 Nov 1857; she was 48. They were divorced.

She sued her husband on July 27, 1852 for divorce claiming for the preceding five years he was cruel and had beaten her. Her suit attempted to enjoin him from selling the property she had brought to the marriage. The outcome of the suit is not known.

Hopkins County's Oldest Citizen is Numbered With the Silent Majority. Mr. Thomas DAVIS, of the Nortonville country, and perhaps the oldest person in Hopkins County, died at his home on the 4th instant, aged 92 years. On account of a peculiar limp in one of his legs he was familiarly called "Hopping Tom." His wife, who is ten years younger, is still living and is at present making her home with her son, B.W. DAVIS, of Morton's Gap. The two old people were both born and reared in Hopkins county and have been living together as husband and wife for more than sixty years. About sixty-five years ago they united with the Christian church and have led consistent and upright lives. It is very probable that no one is now living in the county who has been a member of that church so long as these two good old Christian people. At the time of his death Mr. DAVIS had 131 living descendants, consisting of children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren and greatgreat-grandchildren. He was one among the first who ever hauled goods from Henderson to Madisonville, when the latter town was first incorporated. He, in connection with Mr. John G. MORTON, made railes in their younger days for which they received twenty-five cents per hundred. Mr. MORTON in speaking of this old couple speaks of them in the very highest terms. Mr. DAVIS was during most of his life of a very vigorous disposition, was charitable and was much devoted to his friends. The Hustler, with other friends, wishes to join in expressions of sympathy to the good old wife and mother who is so sadly bereaved. Loving children and affectionate descendants will do all they can to make her life as pleasant as possible during her remaining days, yet none of these can be to her as was him who was her first and only love. [14 Dec 1894 Hustler]

It is in as good condition as when first built. He is a son of Thomas Morton, Sr., and Elizabeth (Davis) Morton, both natives of Virginia. They came to Kentucky in an early day, and settled in what is now Morton's Gap and bought a large quantity of land in this vicinity. The father was born September 25, 1764, and died May 3, 1844. The mother was born September 14, 1776; she died October 7, 1869. After the father's death the property was divided. Our subject retained the homestead with 123 acres of land. **98. Thomas Chiles Davis** (Thomas Chiles "Red Tom"<sup>3</sup>, Richard<sup>2</sup>, Benjamin<sup>1</sup>). Born on 2 Nov 1811 in Frankfort, KY. Thomas Chiles died in Liberty Hill, TX, on 7 Apr 1891; he was 79.

Capt. Thomas Chiles Davis, [born Frankfort, Ky 1811; died Texas 1891; son of Surg. Thomas Chiles Davis and grandson of Col. Richard Davis of Hopkins Co] must have been living at the time at Richmond, Ky, or in Fayette Co, where the disease created considerable havoc. As doctors were few and nurses were scarce and the situation growing more desparate each day, a coterie of young men (including himself) banded themselves together for the purpose of nursing the sick, comforting the dying and burying the dead; volunteering their services where the need was the most urgent.

In his account of his experiences he related that on one occasion they went to a farm house where they found every member of the family dead. All the negro servants had vanished, so they set about the task of attending the stock and cattle which were wailing for attention, feed and water, after which they dug a deep, large hole.

In the barn they had found a half-barrel of tar and smearing their hands and faces with it in the effort to prevent infection, they wrapped the bodies in the available bedding and buried them all in a common grave.

He did not state if there were others of this party who became infected, but he was stricken with the malady. Not being ignorant of medicine he fixed himself what he described as a "powerful dose" and retired to await his destiny. Fortnately he had a good constitution and recovered and lived to be eighty years old; but he never ws fully retrieved from the effects of that attack of cholera.

He did not mention the names of his colleagues in this modest and unlauded act of courage. They went about this volunteer service fearlessly, without recompense or expectation of reward.

In 1835 Thomas Chiles first married Anna Maria Carr, daughter of Charles Carr (1774-1869) & Elizabeth Todd (1782-1865), in Hopkins Cty, KY. Born on 26 Apr 1814 in KY. Anna Maria died in Hopkins Cty, KY, on 3 Aug 1856; she was 42.

There is no proof of his being the son of William and Missianiah. ! Hopkins County Census 1840- Orlander E. Davis (1 M to 5) (1M 20-30) (1F to 5) (1F 20-30). In 1841 William was the grantor of land to Orlando E., 170 acres in Pleasant Run.

Parthena is not listed in 1850. She may have died about 1849. Hopkins County Census 1850 - Orlander E. Davis 37, Aspalis 15 (M), Jane 12, Thomas 10, David 9, Mary 7, William and Baley (M) 3, Byron 1.

Orlando E. Davis was not found in the 1860 nor 1870 Hopkins County Census.

There is a story that Orlando Earl lived in Arkansas and stole a horse. He put all his belongings, his wife and kids, and put them on a sled, and brought them to Kentucky. They lived there a few years and the man from whom he stole the horse

finally found out where he was, came and caught him, and hung him. ( If this happened, it may have been after 1874 and before 1880. In 1880 Orlando Ruben (17 years old) was living with his wife and mother-in-law and Eldred Glover (13 years old) was living with his uncle Dr. Eldred Glover). From an obituary (it is thought to be for Orlando Earl's son) Tom Davis took a prominent part in Forrest City, Ark. Orlando Earl may also have been in Forrest City, Ark. Also, there was a Harry Davis listed in an obituary as a half brother to Byron Davis, a son of Orlando Earl.

This is an area requiring research as there are three possible marriages in Hopkins County: Weir, Alice C. to Davis, O. E. 07/14/1874; Marshall, Elizabeth to Davis, Orlander E. 03/04/1862 ; Thomas, Mary E. to Davis, Orlando R. 12/02/1879.

On 28 Apr 1836 Orlando Earl first married Parthenia Mildred Clark, in Christian Cty, KY. with E W Earle officiating. Parthenia Mildred died abt 1849.

One of the most significant signs of the overturning of public opinion in the last few years is that, in these days, a woman may become learned and wealthy, may have opinions and not be afraid to mention them, may be successful in life, and may be sure that the male sex will no longer try to suppress her, but will bid her "God Speed." The original of the present sketch is one of the most successful business women in the West. She conducts a large millinery establishment in this city, and her name appears on quite as many papers for improvements and for charities, as does any man's of like means in East St. Louis. The family of Mrs. Mulheim is an old one, originally from Wales. The paternal

grandfather came from there and became a large planter near Lexington, Ky. The father of our subject was born in Lexington, and also was a large planter and stockraiser and one of the pioneer settlers of his portion of that State. He took part in the War of 1812, and grew very wealthy and prominent in that section. In 1853, he came to Washington County, Ill., leaving his beautiful home and the social honors that were his, because he could not approve of slavery, and felt that he must get into a free State. He was an old-line Whig, from which class have come giants of intellectual strength among the heroes of the past. Henry Lander was a man of strong convictions of right. He bought about a section of land near Nashville, Ill., and there passed a peaceful life, improving his estate until his death, in 1863. He was a member of the Baptist denomination and departed lamented by all. His name was well known among the Abolitionists of the North. The mother of this remarkable man was an aunt to the family of Breckenridge, and her father was a large planter and one of the first settlers of Christian County, Ky. The Landers were always proud of their descent, as it went back unbroken to those of noble birth in Wales. The beloved mother of our subject was Elizabeth Purcell, a native of Hopkinsville, Ky., and a daughter of the Pennsylvania Purcells. She lived a blameless life, doing her duty as the mother of a large family, and ended her days in Washington County, Ill. The father of Mrs. Muelheim was twice married, five children resulting from the first union and eight from the second. Our subject was the eldest of the children of the second marriage of her father. She was born in Christian County, Ky., October 21, 1834, and that was her home until she was nineteen years old. She was educated at private schools until her marriage, which occurred in Kentucky in 1852, to O.E. Davis, a Kentuckian, a cousin of Jefferson Davis, and who lived but six months after marriage. One child was the result of this union, Harry Davis, who now holds the position of Police Magistrate in East St. Louis. In 1856, Mrs. Davis was married to Charles Muelheim, a native of Cologne, Germany, who had come with his family to America in 1852, and located in Nashville, Ill., and engaged in the drug business. He then went into the management of a store and was a very successful merchant for twenty years. During her life in Nashville, Mrs. Muelheim was a member of Rebekah Lodge, and was a Sister in the Masonic Lodge. In 1872, our subject started in the business which her ability has made so prosperous. She located in East St. Louis in 1882, as she desired to settle her son, Dr. Robert M. Muelheim, in his profession here. Her affairs were in a very flourishing condition, but in 1890 she suffered from a fire, and was burned out. She was not dismayed, but went right to work and soon had her present building of two stories and with a frontage of twenty-five feet erected. She has finest front in her building of any in the city. Mrs. Muelheim has two daughters remaining of her second marriage: Carrie, now Mrs. Charles Foster, who resides in Elmira, N.Y., and Grace, now the wife of L.C. Doggett, the manager of the business of N. K. Fairbanks in St. Louis, Mo. A great grief came to Mrs. Muelheim in 1884, when her talented young son, Robert, was removed by death. He was a brilliant young man, and had graduated with honor from the Jefferson Medical College, when only nineteen years of age. He was graduated an M.D. from the State University, at Champaign, Ill., and there seemed to be a bright future before him, but these hopes were blasted. Mrs. Muelheim is a devout member of the Baptist denomination, as were her ancestors, and has been a Democrat in he political opinions since the Presidency of General Grant. She is a very pleasant lady in social life, and is one who can hold her own and command respect in any

position.

Eldred G Davis, was graduated in the English and scientific course at Shurtleff College, Alton, IL. In 1853 he started the study of medicine under Dr Peter J. Baley, of Adairville, Logan Co, KY, and in the spring of 1855 graduated with high honors from the Nashville Medical College. That spring he started the practice of his profession near Madisonville, until the breaking out of the war when he removed to the town of Madisonville and remained until 1873.

In 1873 he went to Earlington, being induced to do so by the St Bernard Coal Company, where he was the Company Doctor. In 1880 and 1881 he represented Hopkins Co in the lower house of the Kentucky legislature. The Doctor was a member of the I.O.O.F. In politics he was a Democrat. See B268.

On 16 May 1855 when Eldred Glover was 22, he married Susan Vibella "Viola" Baker, 1C3R, daughter of William Richard Baker (1815-1864) & Mary M Whitfield (1819->1880), in Hopkins Cty, KY.<sup>11</sup> Born abt 1838 in Hopkins Cty, KY. On 23 Aug 1802 Elizabeth Janet first married John Gordon III, son of Capt John Gordon II (~1747-1782) & Elizabeth "Betty" Grayson (~1750-1797). Born on 12 Nov 1774 in Culpeper Cty, VA. John died in Sugar Creek Farm, Hopkins Cty, KY, on 8 Oct 1824; he was 49. Occupation: Surveyor.

He came from Virginia, where he was born, to Gordon's Station, a blockhouse on Shawnee Run, a branch of the Dix River, near Harrodsburg, in Mercer County. In 1805 he left Harrodsburg with his Mother and brother William to survey military land grants in Hopkins County.

He was a skilled surveyor and a deputy under his brother-in-law Edmund Talbot, surveyor of Henderson County. He was commissioned by Governor Christophen Greenup on June 4, 1807 as the surveyor for Hopkins County, which was being formed from Henderson County. See B291 for his layout of the city of Madisonville drawn on September 2, 1807. He completed most of the military land grant surveys in payment for military service in the Revolution to veterans living in Hopkins County.

When Hopkins County was formed, the *History of Hopkins County* by Major Maurice Kirby Gordon, page 48 says: "There stood the six-foot-three gaunt body of John Gordon, attired in new doeskins and leggins, he had a bony face with high red cheek bones, a shock of black hair. He carried a tomahawk in his belt, leaning upon his jacob-staff, which is a surveyor's rod. At his feet were his saddle bags containing his compass, this was brought with an eye to business. His brother, Billy Gordon, with fiery red hair, rough clad in homespun, with his trousers in big rawhide boots, with spurs, rode in on his grey stallion, "King William".

John also farmed on Sugar Creek. See B213. He was named the first surveyor of

Hopkins County in 1807 and served until his death in 1824.

He and Abner Martin, his brother-in-law, were in a court battle, and John was fined 1¢ for assault and battery upon Abner. Abner was fined 5 shillings for swearing profanely on the occasion of the assault and a like sum for profanity the next day, still being sore over the assault. See B213.
